Introduction



This camp focuses on Odawa Troops practicing basic winter camping skills and participating in the Odawa "Sub Zero Club", if we are lucky enough to get conditions that allow us to meet the requirements.

For those Troops and Members that have never attended this camp, or need a refresher, here is a bit of a description of the area. The camp is in a wooded area with several large clearings which should give an adequate amount of snow for building quinzhees. Troops are also required to carry or sled in all their gear from the parking lot to their camping area.

<u>First Aid</u>

Every group is responsible for their own first aid. However, if it is a serious first aid issue, please report it to HQ (ODAWA House). ODAWA House and Hyde Away will be kept warm over the weekend. A Scouts Canada Physical Fitness Form or equivalent must be completed for all participants, including adults, and brought to HQ upon arrival (preferably, all forms in one sealed envelope). These will be handed back at check-out.

Camp Opening / Closing / Friendship Campfire / Scouts Own

These events will be common to all. You are welcome to come prepared with a song, a skit or a cheer for the Campfire, which will be informal.

Other Matters

- Each Troop attending must come completely self-sufficient, including water and your own food. Groups are welcome to store their water in the cabin to keep it from freezing.
- Remember to be prepared for changing weather conditions as all activities will be held outdoors.
- Please remember to err on the side of caution keeping the youth safe is imperative. Hyde Away and ODAWAHouse will be available for them to spend the night if they have become too chilled to safely sleep out doors.

Drop off & parking

- The 2nd gate will be down so no cars can pass towards the cabin. The youth will have to
 walk in and out with their gear. Scouters will be allowed access to drive in their troop
 gear and then will be asked to park back on the other side of the gate. Parking near the
 entrance to the big field will depend on how that parking lot is plowed. If plowed such
 that we can park vehicles there, then Scouters will be allowed to park if not, we will
 park behind the gate towards the road.
- All vehicles will remain in designated parking areas and will not leave plowed paths or clearings.
- Cellular phone service for emergencies only, will be available. There are 2 USB charging ports available in ODAWA House for charging phones.
- It is the responsibility of each Troop attending to have completed the necessary Group paperwork that is required to attend the Camp.
- All Scouters are responsible for all Youth present and all Youth are responsible to all Scouters. **Please ensure that your Scouters and Youth are aware of this.**
- There are several **KYBOs** located all around Apple Hill's camping sites.
- Group fires will be raised off the grass/ground using the camp's fire pans.

Any participants interested in assisting with Campfire and/or Scouts Own? (Y/N) ______

To offer Scout aged Youth the learning experience of <u>building</u> and <u>sleeping</u> in a winter shelter, with the view to enhancing their survival skills.

Entry Requirements:

- 1. The Scout or Scouter must sleep one night, preferably with a buddy, in a temporary shelter that ideally makes use of snow.
- 2. Weather conditions must be below $0 \circ C$ (-32 $\circ F$).
- The shelter is to be made using snow and/or tarps and spars (for example: quinzhee, snow trench, snow bank dugout, tree base dugout, lean-to, A-frame, tee-pee or similar structure). This does not include commercially made tents.

- 4. The shelter is to be constructed primarily by the Scout(s) or with members of their patrol or troop.
- 5. This must be part of a properly authorized and documented Scouting activity for Scouts or Scouters from the Odawa Area.
- 6. The successful candidate will receive an Odawa Sub Zero Club woggle as recognition of their experience.

Only new candidates will receive a woggle. Those who have received their woggles already can continue participating for fun and new experiences.
